

TUA | Simplify Short Term Treasury Futures Strategy ETF

FUND OVERVIEW

The **Simplify Short Term Treasury Futures Strategy ETF (TUA)** seeks to provide total return, before fees and expenses, that matches or outperforms the performance of the ICE US Treasury 7-10 Year Bond Index on a calendar quarter basis. The Fund does not seek to achieve its stated investment objective over a period of time different than a full calendar quarter. The fund looks to target the duration of the ICE 7-10 Year US Treasury Index by investing in Treasury futures at the short end of the curve. The fund is designed to provide significant duration from only a modest capital allocation while simultaneously attempting to harvest yield curve efficiencies from the short end of the curve.

The Fund can be used as a replacement for less efficient intermediate duration holdings, as a means of increasing capital efficiency of shorter duration portfolio allocations, or as a building block within innovative portfolio solutions such as risk parity.

PERFORMANCE REVIEW

TUA's total return for the quarter was -6.33%, underperforming the ICE U.S. Treasury 7-10 Year Bond Index return by 1.74%. The primary drivers of return were the fund's long position in the most liquid, near-to-expiry 2-year U.S. Treasury futures contract and its holdings of short-term treasuries and cash. The futures position detracted -7.63% as the rates that underly the valuation of the futures increased by 0.60% over the quarter, while the short-term treasuries and cash positions contributed 1.30%, net of fees.

DEFINITIONS

Duration: A measure of the sensitivity of the price of a bond to a change in interest rates.

Expiry: The time until an option expires. In the context here expiry is used to describe the length of time from when an option position is initiated to when it will expire.

Futures: Derivative financial contracts that obligate parties to buy or sell an asset at a predetermined future date and price. The buyer must purchase or the seller must sell the underlying asset at the set price, regardless of the current market price at the expiration date.

Futures Contract: A legal agreement to buy or sell a particular commodity asset, or security at a predetermined price at a specified time in the future. Futures contracts are standardized for quality and quantity to facilitate trading on a futures exchange.

ICE U.S. Treasury 7-10 Year Bond Index: The Index is market value weighted and is designed to measure the performance of U.S. dollar-denominated, fixed rate securities with minimum term to maturity greater than seven years and less than or equal to ten years.

Market Price: The current price at which shares are bought and sold. Market returns are based upon the last trade price.

NAV: The dollar value of a single share, based on the value of the underlying assets of the fund minus its liabilities, divided by the number of shares outstanding. Calculated at the end of each business day.

Risk Parity: A portfolio construction methodology that builds portfolios by equalizing risk contributions.

SEC 30-Day Yield: The yield is calculated with a standardized formula and represents net investment income earned by a fund over a 30-day period, expressed as an annual percentage rate based on the fund's share price. The yield includes the effect of any fee waivers and/or reimbursements. Without waivers, yields would be reduced. This is also referred to as the "standardized yield", "30-Day Yield" and "Current Yield". The unsubsidized SEC 30-Day Yield does not reflect the effect of any fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements.

Yield Curve: A line that plots yields of bonds having equal credit quality but differing maturity dates.
